GRAMMAR

Adverbs of frequency: always, usually, often, sometimes, never

We put the adverb of frequency before the main verb in the Present Simple:

She always gets up early. I don't usually eat in restaurants.

We put the adverb of frequency after the verb to be: We are never late for school. They aren't often in bed before 10 p.m.

With *always* and *usually*, we need to add extra information:

I always go to the cinema on Saturdays. I usually have coffee for breakfast.




